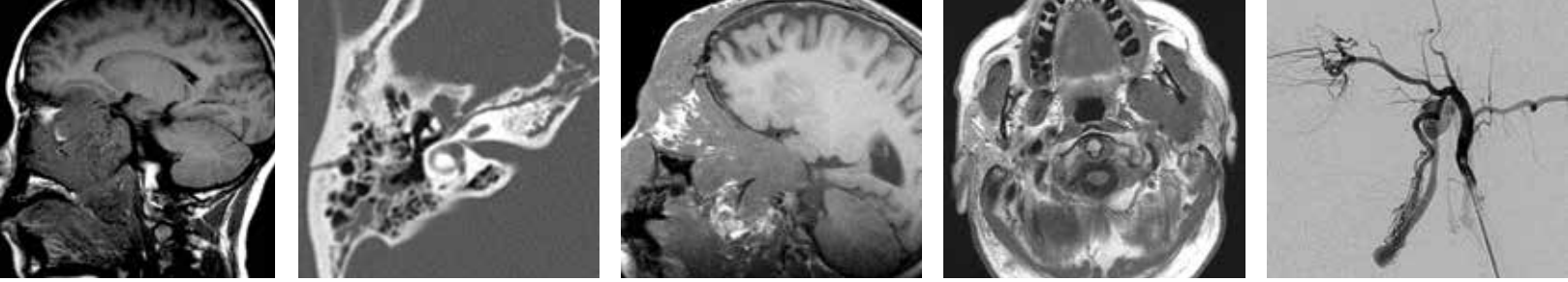

On behalf of the American Society of Head and Neck Radiology, I would like to personally invite you to Las Vegas, Nevada for the ASHNR 51st Annual Meeting, from Saturday, September 16 - Wednesday, September 20, 2017. This meeting, titled *Head and Neck Imaging in the City of Lights*, will feature over 60 head and neck imaging speakers, including well-known experts and new rising stars in the field. The meeting will conclude on Wednesday, September 20 with two SAM sessions covering neck masses, sinuses and maxillofacial imaging.

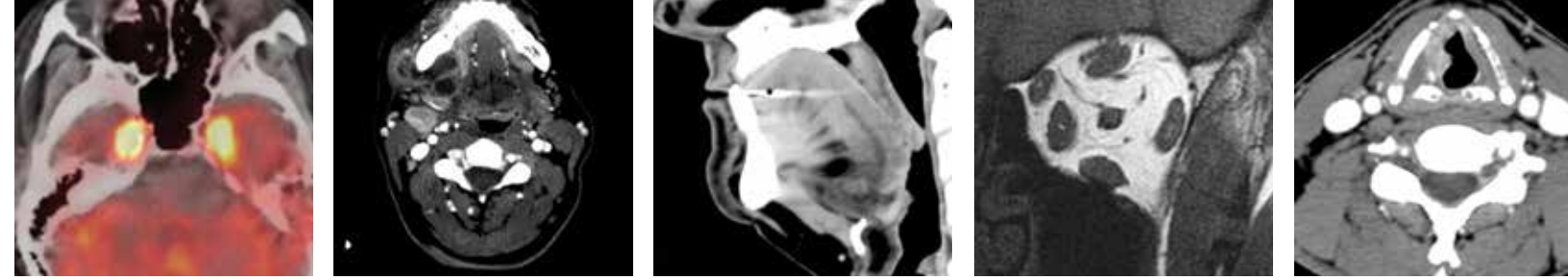

- Recognize imaging features of various developmental lesions of the face, orbit, temporal bone, and neck.
- Evaluate emergent head and neck pathology.
