From The President-Elect and Program Chair

On behalf of the American Society of Head and Neck Radiology, I would like to personally invite you to Las Vegas, Nevada for the ASHNR 51st Annual Meeting, from Saturday, September 16 - Wednesday, September 20, 2017. This meeting, titled Head and Neck Imaging in the City of Lights, will feature over 60 head and neck imaging speakers, including well-known experts and new rising stars in the field. These experienced educators will provide clinically relevant lectures on head and neck anatomy and pathology as well as advanced imaging techniques.

The meeting will begin with the Early Bird Temporal Bone and Skull Base Session on Saturday morning, September 16. Afternoon programming will cover orbit and glandular imaging. Sunday, September 17 will open with a SAM session covering a variety of head and neck topics, followed by lectures on temporal bone and skull base. The meeting will conclude on Wednesday, September 20 with two SAM sessions covering neck masses, sinuses and maxillofacial imaging.

There will be over 26 hours of education available to you. Four sessions will be submitted for SAM qualification.


- General radiologists seeking to improve their understanding and skills in head and neck imaging.

- Recognize imaging features of various developmental lesions of the face, orbit, temporal bone, and neck.
- Evaluate emergent head and neck pathology.


